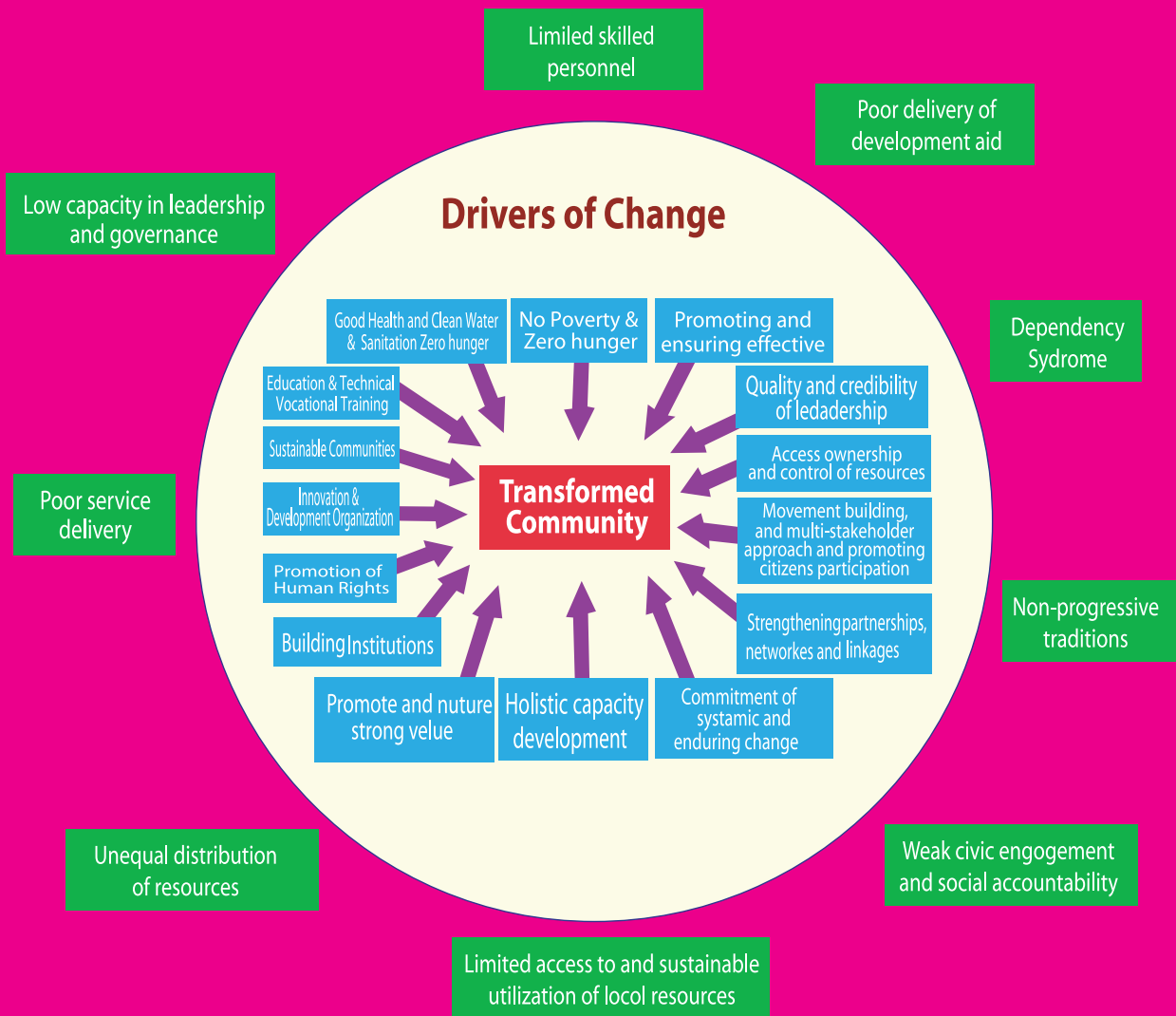

## Letter from the Founder Executive Director



We have already crossed half decades of SDGs and remaining one decade to achieve the SDG Goals for ensuring no one lagging behind. ESDO from the inception of SDGs trying to localize the SDGs for ensuring continued, swift and sustainable transformation of lives and communities.

ESDO followed the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and considering the SDG goal within the reporting year, we addressed Total 83 Projects (13 projects under SDG Goal-1, 7 projects under SDG Goal-2, 7 projects under SDG Goal-3, 5 projects under SDG Goal-4, 2 projects under SDG Goal-5, 4 projects under SDG Goal-6, 2 projects under SDG Goal-7, 5 projects under SDG Goal-8, 4 projects under SDG Goal-9, 3 projects under SDG Goal-10, 4 projects under SDG Goal-11, 4 projects under SDG Goal-12, 18 projects under SDG Goal-13, 1 project under SDG-14, 2 projects under SDG Goal-15, 4 projects under SDG Goal-16). Within this reporting year, ESDO has made some significant innovation for appropriate development initiatives through participatory joint action. The Reporting year of 2019-2020 is also bringing with it a time of immense uncertainty and challenges. COVID-19 and

its aftermath have put the world at risk of reversing all that has been achieved. COVID-19 is expected to leave a permanent mark on the trajectory of delivering SDGs both at country and global levels. Before the onset of COVID-19, overall poverty was declining in the country, to approx. 22% but recent post-COVID estimates imply that overall poverty could climb back to earlier eras at 43%. Marginalized and vulnerable populations face bigger challenges to safeguard their lives and livelihood. Two challenges are relevant from the perspective of structural disadvantages affecting these people – pre-existing vulnerabilities that may get emphasized due to the pandemic, and new vulnerabilities that may push these citizens further behind. Within the very difficult times with the onset of COVID-19 potentially damaging all of our lives, the challenges of poverty and inequality take on even more significance than before. It is expected that these usually lagging -behind groups are likely to be in dire need of policy support for resumption and recovery of their economic activities and social development. It is the right time to comprehend how post-COVID-19 uncertainties will affect SDG delivery, particularly favoring the lagging behind communities, in the specific country context.

We are working in 49 districts currently. As a part of the humanitarian response ESDO have provided assistance to the people in COVID 19. ESDO had implemented 33 projects where 14 was solely COVID 19 and flood response project and 19 was regular project. In this period ESDO have reached to 573463 people with major support like cash, food and hygiene kit support and to 1399413 with critical health support, IGA and livelihood, Skill development, critical medical equipment like PPE Gown, mask, hand gloves, face shield and others awareness activities. Within this period ESDO have provided BDT: 16,24,51,224.00 cash support to 41761 people, as a part of the innovation ESDO had provided 4046 items PPE to the govt. health departments, 500 anti venom to the govt. hospital, PPE to the hospital and law enforcement agencies, constructed a community bridge and established 3 foods Bank.

The Annual Report is not only reflecting our accomplishments but a shared effort of 9.5 million under-privileged Families of 2291 Unions, 137 Municipality, 283 Upazilas under 49 districts & 7 City Corporation, 8 Division of Bangladesh, directly reaching more than 9.5 million poor and vulnerable people. At the same time 1014 Development Volunteers, 4635 ESDO team members who have continued to march ahead with great momentum to bring the best for the community. This Report showcases how ESDO's work with the community, for the community, to the community with combined efforts.

Within the reporting year 2019-2020, ESDO has been expanded both horizontally and vertically by covering more areas and people and integrating activities. We reached with our services to 9.5 million people in 49 districts in 2019-2020. We have made notable achievement in livelihood improvement, food security and nutrition, education, women empowerment, health for child and adolescents, community hygiene, reduction of child labor and rights for ethnic minorities.

At the same time, other than ensuring entitlement and dignity of the target audiences, a fruitful result never is achieved. Innovation, Change, and responsibility of all the concerned stakeholders are the main instrument and vehicle for appropriate development. Considering these points of views, ESDO tries to promote integrated participatory development initiatives within its working areas. Most of the cases thousands of different success examples have already been made and most significant changes have been observed by the local communities and development partners. ESDO has successfully served excellent services especially to un-served and under-served areas and populations like char, urban slums, ethnic minorities, child labour and vulnerable women with the support of our development partner's like minded alliances and other actors.

We always are grateful to the government & development partners for their continuous support and guidance and as an ESDO able to create an enabling environment for most vulnerable communities of Bangladesh.

The General Committee and Executive Committee of ESDO always provided their valuable advice and guidance for ensuring quality services and promoting innovations. We always recognize their most valuable contributions.

The Team members of ESDO have been contributing their dedication and contribution for ensuring best services for our target audience. Very big thanks for them.

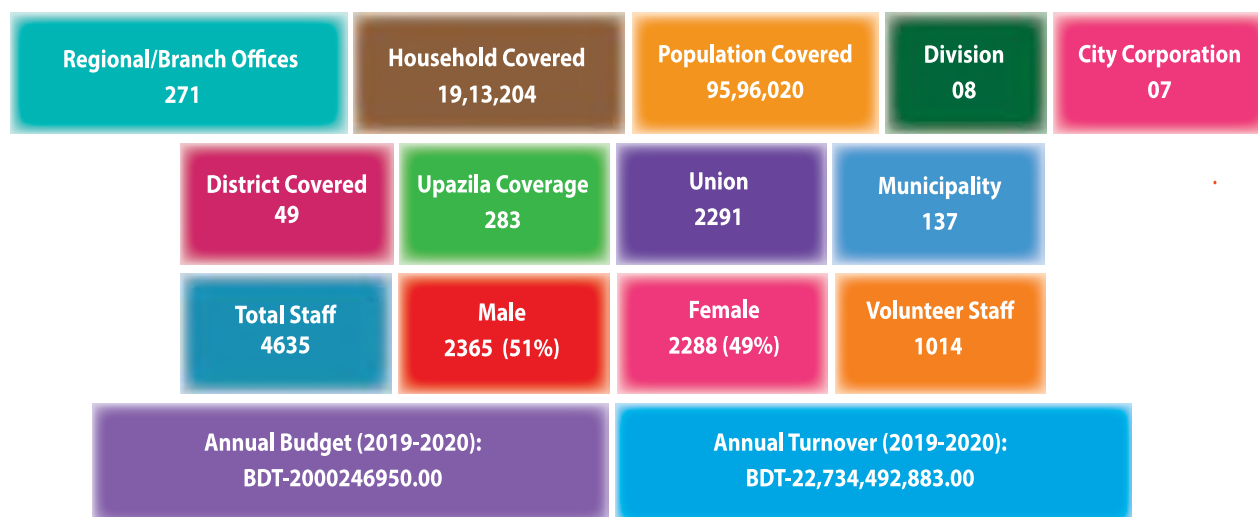

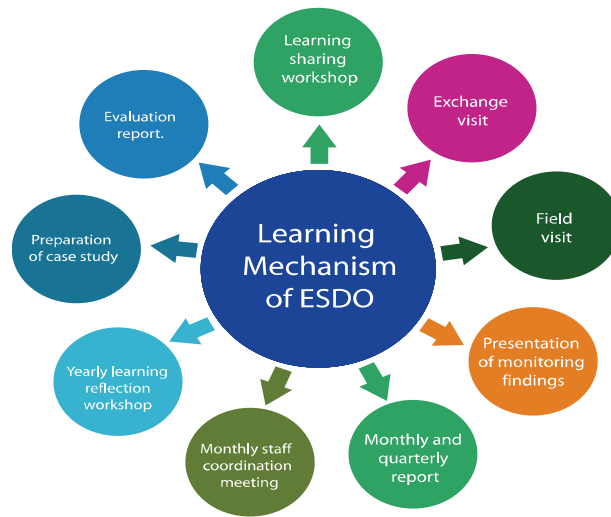

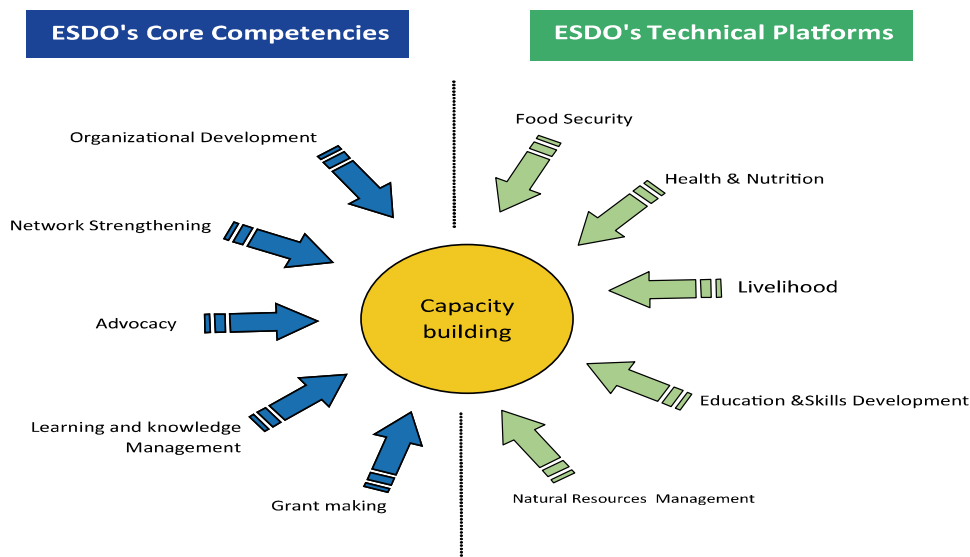

#### COVID 19 Crisis response:

The following support has been provided through the ESDO ENRICH program during the recent COVID 19 crisis:

**Special Health Camp:** COVID-19 Crisis response special healthcare camps have provided medical services to 1359 people in the working area by providing essential medicines free of cost.

**Community Engagement:** COVID-19 Crisis response Social awareness has been increased by hand to hand leaflets while maintaining a safe distance from house to house.

**WASH:** Hand sanitizer, Disinfectant spray has been provided for frequent hand washing and stays environmentally clean of common people in the working area during Corona crisis.

**Logistics:** Hand-washing soaps and masks have been distributed among the 2110 poor people. The help of active youth members under the Youth Social development Activities programs during the Corona Crisis. Hand sanitizers, hand washing soaps and bucket mugs have also been distributed at 10 institutions.

**Food Security:** Relief materials have been provided to 300 poor families through the ESDO ENRICH program during the Corona Crisis.

**Health:** Comprehensive primary healthcare services provided to all the households in the unions through health visitors, health assistants, & MBBS doctors. 270 satellite clinics held once a Financial Year in each ward including referral arrangement with specialized medical services on subsidized; and for the very poor, services are provided free of cost both public and private hospitals and clinics. Health camps (vision, dental, heart, diabetes, etc) are also organized with specialist doctors. De-worming campaign, distribution of free medicine to 100% of it registered households, covering all household members above 5 years of age. Within the reporting period, a total of 11316 households have acquired health cards up. Also, 23187 patients have been treated in static and satellite clinics respectively, and 16 health camps have been conducted treating 3739 patients.

**Sanitation:** 100 percent safe sanitation ensured in Auliapur & Bachor union of Thakurgaon District.

**Education:** The ENRICH education component primarily seeks to address the problem of drop-out of children from primary level education. Under this component, at least students up to Class 2 are helped in the educational assistance centers to prepare the next day's tasks, given that there are no facilities and Educational support for many students at their homes. Gradually, these centers will accommodate students up to Class 5. In 135 afternoon educational assistance centers in the 04 ENRICH unions, 135 teachers have been assisting 18763 students (girls and boys). The dropout rate among these students, as they move up to Class 3, has, on average, come down to about 0.5%, while it is about 4.5% nationwide.

The teachers and parents of the school are happy to see the results of the respective children in their respective primary schools from class II to class II. They later applied for extension of the program from III class to V class. In continuation of this, PKSF has recently undertaken programs to improve the quality of children's

education through ESDO along with other organizations involving the local population. A project titled Reaching All Children in Education (RACE) is being implemented to formulate appropriate education support programs to improve the quality on education of children.

**Education Scholarship:** Meritorious children of the disadvantaged or low income parents involved in different PKSF supported programs, who, after successfully completing Secondary School Certificate (SSC) level, are studying for Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) or are at a higher level are eligible for this scholarship. Within the reporting year, a total of 66 students and Total BDT: 7,92,000.00 have been awarded scholarships.

**Campaigns:** Campaigns against social evils such as drug addiction, child marriage, child labour, teasing of girls and women, dowry, violence against women, trafficking of women and children etc. Are a major trustable area under the ENRICH Social Development Unit.

**Special Credit Services:** Three types of special credit services have been designed for the ENRICH households, Income Generating Activities Loan (IGAL), Livelihood Improvement Loan (LIL), and Asset Creation Loan (ACL). All the three credit services can be accessed simultaneously by a household. Within the reporting period, a total of BDT 8,52,87,000.00 (IGA: 7,95,22,000.00, ACL: 53,45,000.00, LIL: 4,20,000) has been disbursed under these three loan schemes.

**Social Capital Formation:** The preparation of family development plans in consultation with all members of the households sitting together boosts cohesiveness among family members and, hence, family level social capital. Members of the community are encouraged to meet and socialize in ENRICH centers or elsewhere and undertake joint activities for common good. A strong coordination mechanism has already done in between Govt.-LGI-Private sectors & NGOs.

**ENRICH Centre:** An ENRICH center is being established in every ward of the ENRICH unions. This center is serving as a hub for people of the ward to socialize and listen each other. The center is, in fact, a multipurpose entity. As a matter of policy, the land is provided by the local community and the Enrich meets the costs of the building so that there is an inherent local ownership within the reporting period 19 number of ENRICH center have been established.

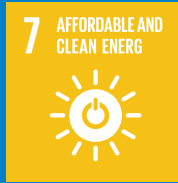

Through linkage with a project of DLS named "Eradication of PPR and FMD control Project" vaccination camps have been organized where local paravets and DLS project vaccinators were present there. For "Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD)" although there is no vaccine for this disease but DLS provide Goat pox vaccine as experimental to healthy cattle.





- As a result of learning session the producers are now aware about fodder cultivation, a total of 80 commercial Napier grass plots have been established and 703 PooCs have planted 923 Moringa trees at homestead area. Due to these initiatives the producers will be able to reduce the production cost for feeding and medicine.

- During the reporting period NNMC has done some advocacy dialogues with govt. to get access of Adibashi and Dalit communities on those 4 component, these are,
- Upazila Advocacy Platforms successfully conducted 29 dialogues with the Upazila level government Officials at different 29 Upazilas under the project areas. Average 8 government officials including UNO participated in every meeting.
  - District Advocacy platforms conducted 9 dialogues with the District level Govt. officials at project areas. Average 14 government officials including Deputy Commissioner participated in every meeting. Resulting of Advocacy dialogue with Govt. NNMC has some Major achievement on those accesses. These are given below,
  - 40 Dalit families have got houses from govt. housing project at Nilphamari Sadar Upazila. 10 Adibashi families have got houses at Badarganj Upazila.
  - 92 pregnant & lactating mothers (Adibashi and Dalit) received govt. maternal allowance in different Upazilas.
  - 228 Adibashi people have got old age allowance from govt. at separate Upazilas.
  - 70 Adibashi and Dalit women got widow allowance from the respective govt. department in the different Upazilas.
  - A total number of 1503 Adibashi and Dalit children got stipend from the education department of government.
  - 1027 Dalit and Adibashi people got relief (food and Blanket) from the Prime Minister's Office at different Upazilas.
  - 25 disable Dalit and Adibashi people got disable allowances in NNMC working areas different Upazilas.
  - 443 Adibashi and Dalit young men and women have got technical training (Tailoring, computer

- operating, Hair dressing, Shoe making, Mobile servicing) from Social welfare department and received average BDT. 15,000 per trainees.
- A total number of 25 Adibashi youth of Rangpur have got job at different private sector after getting training from Govt. TTC (Technical Training Center)
- 30 Adibashi students (Girls-20, Boys-10) students have got Bicycle at Badarganj Upazila.
- A total amount of BDT 9, 00,000/- distributed among 180 families of Adibashi families (Per families BDT 5000) of Badarganj Upazila from Social Welfare department. This support has come from the honorable Prime Minister's support fund.
- 2 Deep Tube-wells have received by Adibashi Communities at Fulbari Upazila.
- A dalit youth has received 1 Auto Bike from UNO office of Domar Upazila (Support from the office of Honorable Prime Minister)
- Project also organized 1 batch training program (Training on RBA, Advocacy and networking) for the capacity building of the Platform members. 34 leaders (male 25, Female-9) of different platforms have participated in the training program.
- NNMC Platforms actively participated in important 3 day observations in local level. (International Indigenous day, CARAM "The 2nd largest religious and cultural program of Adibashi communities)" and International Human Rights Day).
- NNMC also organized a dialogue on SDG with the joint collaboration of CPD, HEKS/EPER and ESDO for in favor of Dalits and Adibashi basic service in relation to SDGs goal at Thakurgaon. Mr. Fazle Hossain Badsha, honorable MP, Dr. Debapriya Bhattacharya, distinguished fellow of Center for Policy Dialogue (CPD), Local Govt. Officials and members of Civil Society participated the dialogue session.

- For the smooth relation of Adibashi culture NNMC also organized an Adibashi fair on Adibashi culture with the joint collaboration with HEKS/EPER at Dinajpur.
- NNMC supported to the Munda (Adibashi community) community at Naogaon district for their Annual Munda Convention. Mr. Shahiduzzaman Sarker, Member of Parliament (MP), Mr. AKM Shahidul Islam, District Judge, Naogaon, Local Govt. officials and Political leader were present the convention.
- During this period NNMC developed a flipchart on access to the govt. basic services according to the HRBA as IEC/BCC materials. These flipcharts have distributed among the VDC (Village Development Committee) of partners organizations.
- Without that achievement NNMC also provided some humanitarian support for the most vulnerable people during the Covid-19 situation.
- A total number of 1161 households of Dalit, (741 HHS), Adibashi (399 HHS) and mainstream (921 HHS) communities of 20 Upazilas under 8 districts of North -West of Bangladesh received food assistance from Advocacy Platforms. Total BDT 4, 55,000/- spent for the food assistance.

#### Most significant changes:

It has established Advocacy Platforms (District and Upazila) as an effective platform for the Adibashi and Dalit communities to protect their rights with the collaboration of Mainstream communities. ### The Major achievements:

**Beneficiaries Data Base:** Primary data of 3,217 students (direct beneficiaries) from 12 schools collected and data base developed. Court yard formation: Formed 240 court yard groups round 12 school catchment formed area consisting of 6,000 members are now better aware and prepared to face

flood, earthquake lightning and breaking out of fire.(3 sessions conducted). 602 courtyard sessions were conducted where 17,343 (not one count) participants (16,792 male, 551 female) took part in these sessions and formations on an average of 29.

**Mock drill:** Project conducted 12 mock drills. In twelve mock drills a total of 1,824 participants took part (Not one count). From these mock drill participants increased their response skill for search and rescue to response in any disaster drawing attention of community.

**Youth forum development training:** Conducted two batch youth forum capacity building training for court yard session where 63 selected youth took part from three unions. This training and mock courtyard session increased their skill level.

**Staff Training:** Staff of Safe School Project(15 participants from project) get a two day residential training on MEL, Documentation & Influencing Training in TDH center provided by Plan International is helpful to achieve project goal and objective.

**Small scale construction work for disaster risk mitigation:** a) Constructed one wash block including dumping system for girls. b) Pond filling with sand in two school to reduce the risk of drowning of children and extension of playground c) Boundary wall construction in to school to protect students from

any accident's) Boundary wall construction: Constructed a boundary for student's safety while they are in school. These construction works are helping school to provide safe and secure learning space for students keeping alliance to DRESS project.

**Capacity building training for Emergency in Education:** Project conducted 4 EiE training in 4 school (8 from school covers from DRESS) to continue education and provide a message to the society through the training that there is no option to stop education where a total of 124 participants took part among them 13 girls (student), 11 boys (students), women 42, men 58. Endrogarh High School remained opened in the flood of 2019 in a rented house situated in a high place. Others schools are closed for a short time in the flood of '19.

**Capacity building training for tasks force, SMC on CiE (Communication in Emergency):** Safe school project provided 4 school wise capacity building training for SMC, taskforce groups on Communication in Emergencies(8 from school covers from DRESS). There were 46 female and 45 male including 18 girls, 15 boys, attend in selected 4 school based training.

**Youth forum formation and meeting at union level:** Project conducted 17 union level meeting (with formation) took place. 3 Youth forum formed at union level in 3 unions. There are 254 member among the male, 136, female, 98, 9 girl, 11 boys. Members from this forum maintain link with other group in their catchment.

**Student's task force quarterly meeting:** Project conducted 36 quarterly meeting with Students task force. A total of 1067 participants took part in these meeting. Tasks force group members (300) maintain contact with general students to continue studies as school is closed.

**Quarterly meeting of youth groups in school catchment area:** Project conducted 48 quarterly meeting with Students task force. A total of 1092(Not one count) participants took part in these meeting. In their last quarterly meeting they planned and worked centering corona and flood and worked in accordance with it providing families soap, detergent and homemade masks from their pocket money. Announced message through loud speaker and mike from mosque to combat corona virus. Youth also hanged and distributed posters circulating message to combat corona.

**EiE support:** Provided EiE support in one school to continue education of 253 students because schools construction work was going on and it was November and exam was close.

**Complain box:** Project set up 12 complain box in 12 schools and 2 in two offices. Schools are in conservative area so now they can use complain box throwing complain. They formed a committee to operate this box in each school.

**Workshop on stop child marriage with SDMC and CSO:** Project has organized a daylong 12 workshops on child protection and stop child marriage for School Management Committee (SMC), Civil Society Organization (CSO) and School Disaster Management Committee (SDMC) representatives. A total of 373 participants participated including 118 women, 175 men, 79 students (47 girls, 33 boys). Teachers are circulating different message to school and communities like providing mobile no of up, police, upazila administration.

**Day observation:** Approximately, 2,200 participants in day observation. Project observed International day for disaster risk reduction on 13th of October, National Disaster Preparedness Day on 10 March and World Environmental Day on June 05. Activities like day observation creating awareness to face disaster.

Distribute play materials for students for joyful learning school environment: Project distributed football, cricket set, volleyball etc items were distributed in 12 schools covering 3,217 student. Significantly girls are being habituated to play in schools being from a conservative society.

**Support students in tree plantation:** Project planted 60 palm trees in twelve schools circulating message of nature protection uphold message of increasing lightning.

**Video documentation on good practices of safe school project:** Project has produced a documentary upholding the background of safe school project. The duration of the video was 15 minutes and shared with Plan International Bangladesh.

**IEC material printing:** Project has printed an IEC material (1,000 copies) for class room username "Knowledge practice card for disaster resilience"- "We play, we learn" and distributed among different stake holder. Disaster related message is circulated through these IEC materials. Students are now familiar to different terms of disaster.

**Quarterly Meeting/ session with students council, teachers, SMC, education authority and CSO:** Project conducted 48 Quarterly Meeting/ session with students council, teachers, SMC, education authority and CSO where a total of 2,138 participants took part in these 48 quarterly session. Agenda of these meeting were





centered on corona and flood and they are doing in accordance of it. During this school closing period the contact with 3,217 students dividing themselves. Distributed relief to 17 poor families from their own initiative. Ward Disaster Management Committee (WDMC):12 school catchment area covers 11 WDMC committee. Total 235 members have been included in 11 WDMCs. Segregation is male =147, Female = 88 and 5 physically unfit (disable) among them 2 male 3 female women included in the WDMC. Ensuring home quarantine outsider with local administration.

**Develop and disseminate case studies:** Project has published 4 case studies. Project has published 1000 copies. This dissemination ensured replication of project activities in another 4 local school (Kochakata High School of Kochakata up, Golerhat Dhakil Madrasha of Keder up, Charbolorampur Prantonibash GPS and Mothergonj High School of Bollover Khas up)

**Lesson learnt workshop at sub-district and district level:** annual learning and sharing meeting at Upazila conference room Nageshwari under Kurigram district. 25 students got monthly allowance for lifelong education time from these meeting.

**Organize capacity development training on Child Projection in Emergency (CPiE):** Total 277 participants took part in the day long training session among them there were female 123 and male 154 including 43 girls and 26 boys in 10 schools. Now participants know how problems and remedy of child protection in Emergencies'.

**Workshop with SMC, UDMC, and CSO on stop child marriage and child protection measure in school and community:** A total of 84 participants took part including 9 female and 75 male. There they made some decision and implemented almost all of them in three workshop in three union. Up issued letter to each and every educational institution describing bad effects and articles related to child marriage.

Organized child lead advocacy workshop at upazilla on safety & protection of school environment. Safe School project conducted a 'Child Lead Advocacy Meeting on Safety & Security in School Environment' at Upazila level at officers Club, Nageshwari under Kurigram.

**Orient union Disaster management on DRR and CCA principles & role of committees:** Project oriented 3 Union level disaster management committee where 121 participants took part among them 16 female and 105 male. From these meeting 16 connecting road has been constructed and repaired for the easy access to students on the way to school.

Most significant Changes:

1. Replication of project activities in non-targeted schools
2. Students and teachers learnt different terms related to disaster and used to disseminate to their families with increased attendance in the class with a view to mitigate disaster havoc.
3. Now students feel free about menstrual hygiene in the school.

**Improve safe accessibility to and from school for all students, especially children/person with disabilities:**

School's ramp has been completed in 06 school.

**Installation of thunderbolt:** Installed 8 thunderbolts to protect lightning. This activity created mass awareness to the common people about the increasing magnitude of thundering.

**Pond filling:** Two ponds filling with sang for the extension of playground and increasing safety from drowning. Earlier school field was fit for playing for students. Now students can play without any difficulties. More over pond filling is reducing the risk of drowning being a flood prone area.

**Boundary wall construction:** Constructed boundary wall in one school. School is situated beside busy road because of this wall students got safety of it

**DRESS Project conducted training on EiE and CiE:** Conducted 16 Training (8 on EiE, 8 in CiE) increased their skills and understanding. Endrogarh High School of Nageshwari upazila continued their education during the flood of '19 in a rented house and other schools affiliated to project followed them starting school within a very short time.

### Most significant Changes:

1. Schools being disaster resilient, beautiful looking with new construction, repairing. No class is canceled due to the lack of classroom.
2. Stakeholder came to know the importance of continuation of studies and managed education during disaster making it as habit, being situated in disaster prone area like flood.
3. Schools environment changed talking with menstrual hygiene management establishing with dumping system.

### The Galleries

**River Gallery:** Bangladesh is a riverine country. Bangladesh, a country of 56000 Square mile, is crisscrossed by many rivers. The River Gallery was open to the visitors in 2016. An amazing fact is that water of almost all the rivers is preserved here. Many objects of river-centric different occupations are also displayed here. Moreover, this gallery has a rich collection of objects, inventory of rivers, information of boats, boat festivals, bhatiali song, and rural folk music composed out of love for river and nature. Information on char, flood, fisheries, birds, are also presented here. Our rivers are our best assets; our best friends too. However, a coordinated effort is required to save these rivers, canals, beels from decay and death. It is we who can make this earth a livable dwelling for all of us.

**Plain Land Ethnic Minority Gallery:** Bangladesh is a dwelling place of multi ethnic people. This country has a rich cultural heritage along with diversified culture of ethnic minority. This gallery is dedicated to the ethnic minority of plain land. Lokayan has demonstrated their livelihood, culture, dwelling, dress, food habit, occupations, festivals, and other social events.

**Grassroots Folk Gallery:** This grassroots folk gallery was open to visitors in 2006. Some important collections are as follows: Agriculture: Plough, Ladder, Spade, Sickle, Winnow, Sieve, weeder, axe, chopper, crowbar, doolie, cooking tools etc; these implements are locally made of stone, wood and iron. Herbal Medicine and Treatment: Mortar and pestle, small pot made of Stone, Amulet (protective metal ring used for protection against evil), protective garment, spell stick etc. Cultural Instruments: Dhak, Dhol, Flute, Hollow Cylindrical instrument for music beaten with sticks, small Hollow Cylindrical instrument, Drum, Single string and double string music instrument, Mrdanga,

**Liberation War Gallery:** As a tribute to the martyrs of independence war ESDO built 'Aparajeo Ekattor' in 2012. ESDO also built a sculpture 'Muktiro Mandiro Sopanotole' to pay tribute to sacrifices in liberation war. It also renovated the grave of first martyr Mohammad Ali of Thakurgaon, who sacrifice his life for the cause of freedom. Liberation War Gallery at Lokayan Life Diversity Museum has also been created. This Gallery has been divided in different corners named Old Age, Middle Age, 1757-1947, 1947-1971 and exclusively Nine Month of Independence. Memoirs of different wars as well as of liberation war are preserved here with due honor. The main objective of Liberation War Gallery is to present the history of Liberation War through demonstration of liberation war related films and features & audio visual library.

- Reducing district level Case filing particularly at higher courts (District courts).
- District court has transferred 1139 (5 %) disputes to Village courts for resolving which is under village court jurisdiction.
- UP bodies as well as District level project are adapting differently strategies to disseminate VC message at community level 1. Outreach (Showing video on VC at secondary school) 2. Miking at community level 3. Conduction of outreach by other NGO through the motivation of Upazila administration.
- Village Police are encouraged with monthly incentive which makes them more sensitized to take part dissemination VC message at community level at the time of distributing summon.

- Women are being empowered through participating in Village Court trial session as a panel member which consequently making women applicant more courageous and setting example of getting justice for women. During the reporting period 21% women were supported as panel member.
- All walk of people are participating in Courtyard session to know the VC message 25343 courtyard meeting had conducted among them male participants were 134737(33%) and female were 279180 (67 %)
- VCA has conducted 41009 counseling with the justice seeker where was 23662 (58 %) male and 17347(42 %) Female.
- Trend of moving district courts with trivial case has been reducing gradually at community level.
- Women elected leaders has trained up through WDF workshop which has inspired them to grow interest to women to seek justice to village courts (28%) that has able to establish gender justice and social equity as well.
- ESDO- has availed the opportunity to participate as observer member of Law and order Committee and Legal Aid Committee meeting which has enabled the project staffs to deliver update VC message to concern stakeholder for better understanding that ultimately contributing for well-functioning village courts.

5 PPE have been distributed to Upazilla Chairman and Upazilla Nirbahi Officer in Baliadangi and Haripur Upazilla.

4 youths have donated blood to different patient.

Youth helped Upazilla Nirbahi office of Haripur to identify no house HH under 'there is land but there is no house' project.

01 free health camp was organized as part of voluntarism in Pirganj Upazila where about 100 patients have been received treatment with the support of Upazila health complex.

Youths have established a youth bazaar discounting 35% in town of Thakurgaon district.

Government has relaxed lock down ensuring health rules but general people are not following 6 major health rules properly. So youth leaders have submitted a memorandum to DC and UNO for controlling people to maintain these rules. Moreover in tackling corona virus youths are continuing disinfecting work through spray machine regularly in 3 municipalities, 28 Union, and 5 Upazilla of Thakurgaon district till date.

01 Virtual platform have been established and 05 computer centers have been established in 05 Upazila through which 6600 youth have been active in website, Face book, messenger group and YouTube.

- 56 Youth have developed as youth ambassador through different types of training.

**Result area of the project:**

- 4,200 youth will be equipped with life skill knowledge
- 1,800 youth will be developed as leaders
- 350 youth will be involved in Income generation activities
- 130 youth will represent in different forum

**Key result area of the project**

- 1275 youths have received life skill training and they are practicing their way of life.

UNDP and ILO have already provided funding support for ESDO Popular Theater. Objectives of ESDO Popular Theatre: (i) Enhancing access to information and awareness of grassroots communities on various socio-economic issues, rights, resources and services through infotainment (ii) Promoting the voices of the poor and disadvantaged, especially women (iii) Promoting community participation in local development and



popular theatre performers as grassroots human rights activists (iv) Exploring indigenous folk culture, traditions, and creative arts and utilizing them for the development of rural communities, Impact of Popular Theatre: Popular Theatre is collectivizing and transforming rural communities and unites them to address social injustice and exploitation. Popular Theatre also promotes women's empowerment. Women are being exposed to new information and ideas through plays, which they did not have access to before. Watching shows as a community is increasing their mobility in society, allows for gender-mixing, and provides a platform for contributory discussions. Women develop a higher confidence level as their voices and opinions are heard in the participatory discussions after the play. Simply watching a play becomes a vital form of communication since it creates sustainable and gradual shifts in perceptions without directly threatening local culture and traditions.

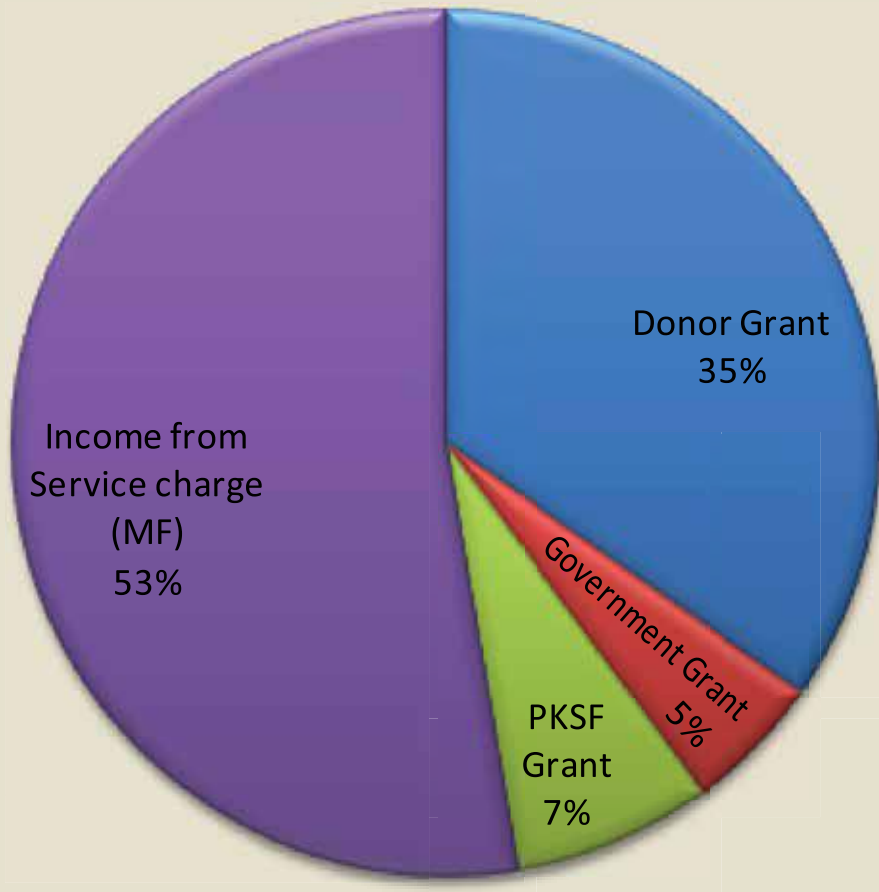
- Within the reporting year performed more than 300 shows with the support of different donors.

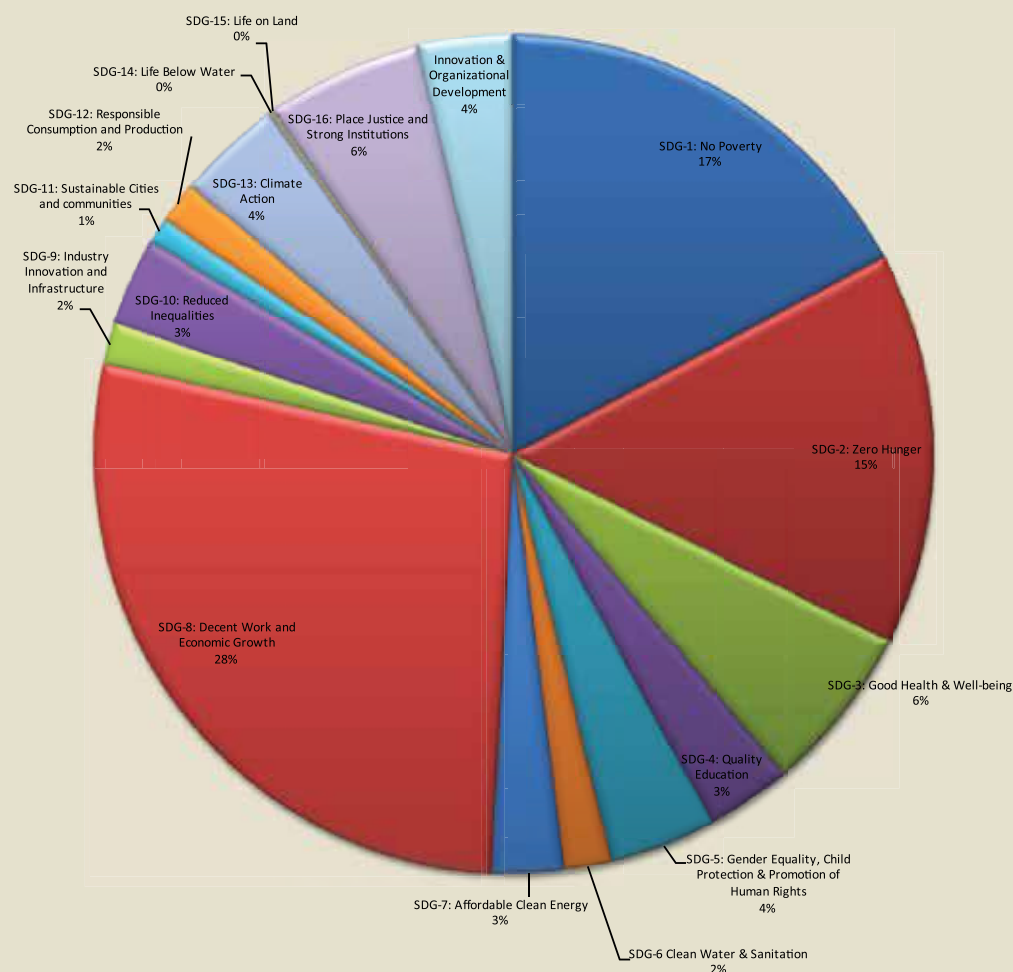

# ESDO Governance

## Governance System

**General Committee (GC):** According to ESDO Organogram, General Committee is the highest forum of ESDO. ESDO is governed by a 21 member Governing Committee (GC). We organize Annual General Meeting (AGM) in each financial year, where all GC members reviewed yearly progress achievements, outcomes and emerged issues and at the same time approved yearly budget, previous years financial statements and appointed external audit firm.

**Executive Committee (EC):** The General Committee selects a 7 members Executive Committee for 3 years period. Executive Committee governs and providing policy guideline to Executive Director.

**Executive Director (ED):** The Executive Director is the Member Secretary of Executive Committee as well as the Chief Executive of ESDO. Executive Director ensuring organizational governance as well as administer the organization for ensuring quality of the service.

**Senior Management Team (SMT):** The Executive Director is delegated by the Executive Committee to run and manage the ESDO and oversee the implementation of all its programs. The Senior Management Team (SMT) comprising of 07 senior officials (appropriate representation from program, finance, admin, M&E, MIS) and they are ensuring quality implementation of all programs of ESDO. Regular monthly meetings held to review progress and issues of concern.

**Central Coordination Unit (CCU):** ESDO Central Coordination Unit (CCU) consists of 21 Senior Officials (Finance, HR, Program, Administration, MIS, Training Wing). Executive Director is the Chairman of CCU and Program Coordinator is the member secretary of CCU. CCU meeting regularly held on monthly basis with all CCU members.

**Regional Coordination Unit (RCU):** ESDO has been continuing 5 regional coordination unit for ensuring coordination between central and field level offices. All district focals are the member of RCU and RCU meeting regularly organize on quarterly basis.

**District Focal Team (DFT):** District Focal Team (DFT) is the coordination unit of all ongoing programs under any district. The senior most official of the district level act as district focal team leader and all project chiefs involved as team member of DFT. In generally DFT meeting held on monthly basis but if needed it will be conduct any time.

**Upazila Focal Team (UFT):** Upazila Focal Team (UFT) is the coordination unit of all ongoing programs under any Upazila.

# Human Resources

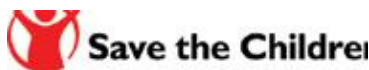

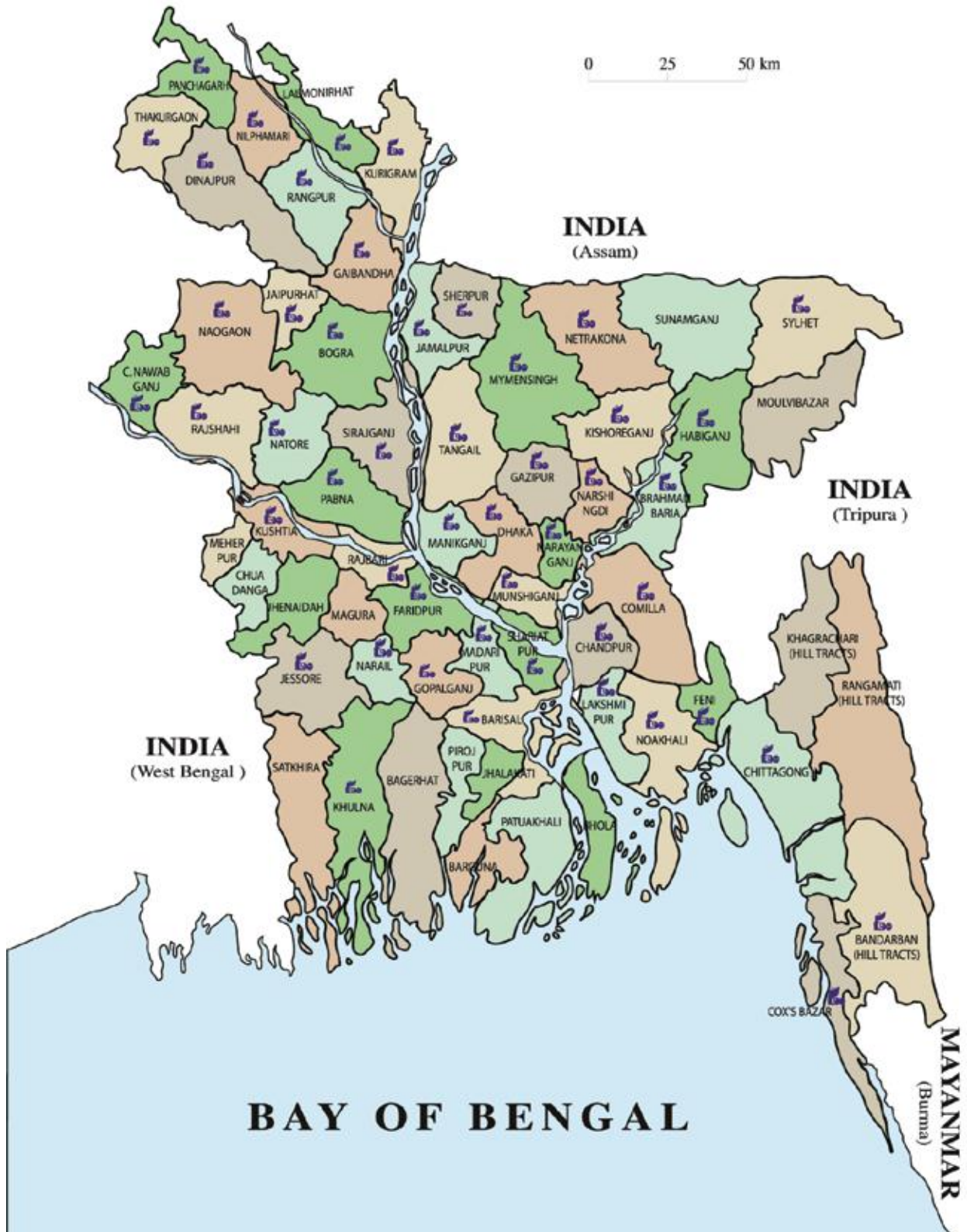
